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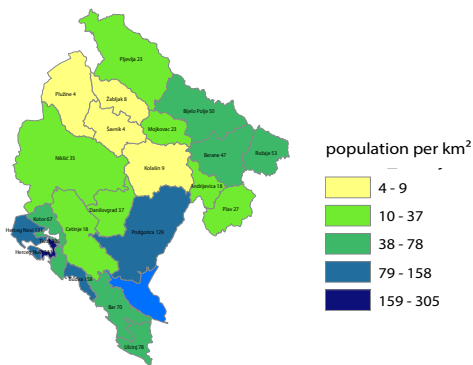

Population by age group and sex, Census 2011

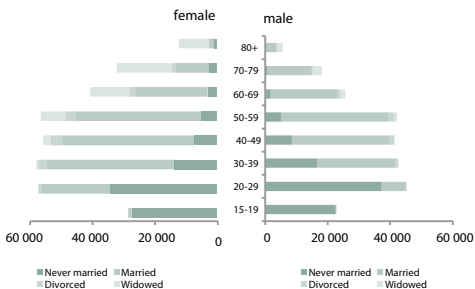

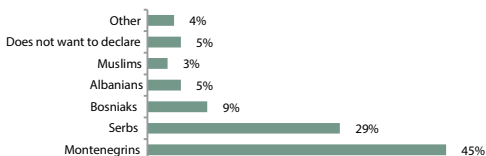
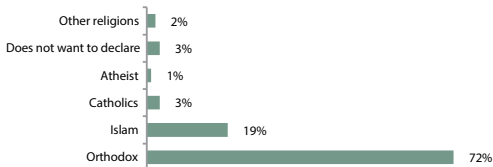

Population aged 15 and over by marital status, Census 2011



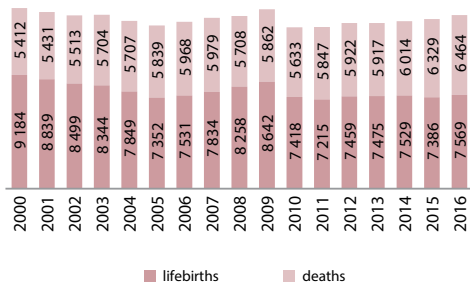

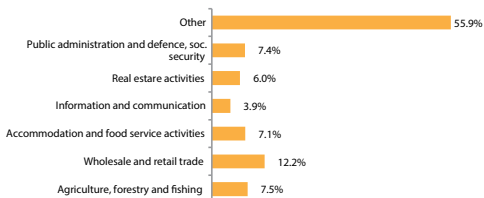

Structure of GDP by activities at current prices, 2015

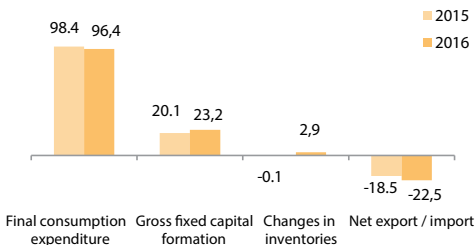


Structure of GDP by activities at current prices, 2016

Structure of GDP by type of expenditure at current prices, 2015 and 2016

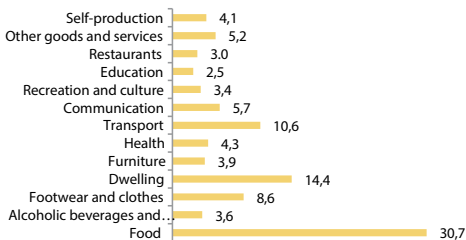

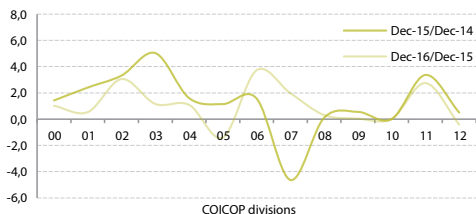
